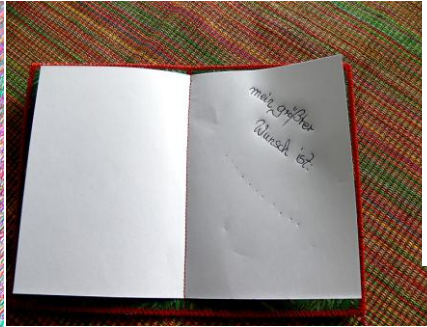




Wish list booklet



How could you explain to someone what your most important wishes are, any better than with a booklet just made for the purpose? For anyone who can't write yet, they can easily paint their wish, while an adult in the family is sewing the booklet. Not only for children's wishes, but also for birthdays or other occasions, here is how to make it clear what your special request is, in an individual way.

..... You can also sew in even more pages! (For many requests)

Materials:

Decovil or S 230 cut DIN A 5, red cotton fabric for the star, approx. 15 x 15 cm, approx. 40 x 30 cm green patterned cotton fabric,

crayon, 1m velvet ribbon approx. 90 cm long, 5 mm wide,

thread: POLY SHEEN® red or green thread 200 m, silver and gold Metallic thread.

A sheet of white DIN A4 paper for the wish list and paper for the star (stencil), scissors, tape measure or ruler, general sewing equipment.



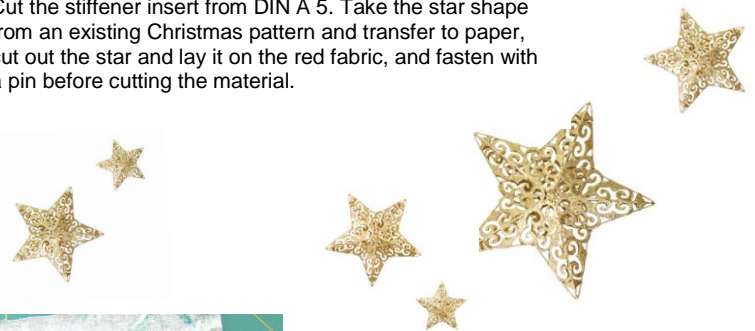
Step 1

Cut the stiffener insert from DIN A 5. Take the star shape from an existing Christmas pattern and transfer to paper, cut out the star and lay it on the red fabric, and fasten with a pin before cutting the material.



Step 2

Lay the decorative fabric star on the green cloth, which is also fitted a2 x on the DIN A 5. The star points should not go over the borders.





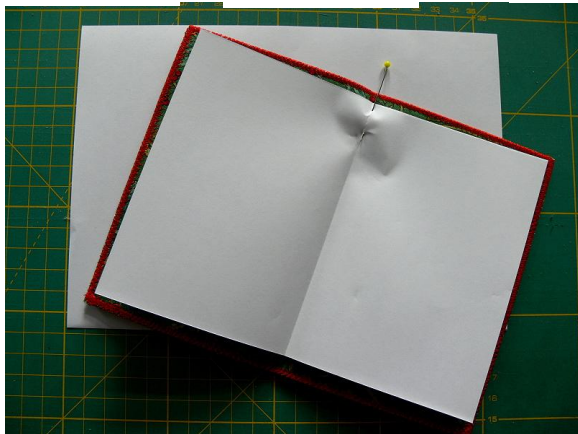
Step 3

Embroider the star alternately with gold and silver thread and fasten over the fringes. Once the star is sewn on the decorative fabric and the stiffening, the inside of the booklet is covered with the second piece of green cloth and the book edges are trimmed as follows with zig-zag stitches.:

1. Border: 6.5/1.0
2. Border: 6.0/1.0 and
3. Border: 5.5/1.0

Step 4

Cut the paper slightly smaller than DIN A5, so that it doesn't protrude over the edge of the book. Stitch the paper to the center of the booklet with stitched lines. When using Decovil, you can use a jersey needle in the sewing machine, since this stiffening material is very elastic and soft and easy throughout.
